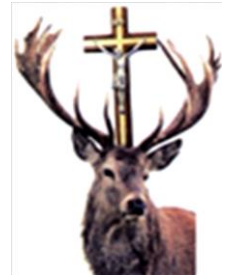

Dear Parishioners,

This Wednesday we celebrate the Feast of St Catherine of Siena, patron saint of Europe and patron of our local school academy. Let us call upon her intercession during this difficult time as we give thanks to God for the gift and example of her life. The saints of the Church provide us with a great variety of different people from different backgrounds living out the Gospel in obedience to their own personal vocation. One thing I would always recommend is to read the lives of the saints and allow yourself to be inspired by their stories. Although you cannot go to the library or bookshop at the moment you can always order a book online or download it onto your kindle. As well as many good biographies of the saints (for example there is a good biography of Catherine of Siena by Alison Cultrayne) there are also many works of an autobiographical nature by the saints themselves. One of the better-known examples of this is St Therese of Liseux's *Story of a Soul*.

This Saturday (25th April) was the Feast of St Mark the Evangelist, author of the Gospel of Mark. Although Mark's Gospel comes after Matthew's Gospel in the bible most scripture scholars consider Mark's gospel to be the oldest of the four and therefore the one that was written nearest in time to the events that it describes. The Gospels are eye-witness accounts of events that took place. They also bear the fruit of decades of theological reflection on the meaning of those events. When we read the Gospels, we read about the life of Jesus. We come to know him better and we deepen our relationship with Him.

Spiritual communion.

Although you cannot receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament at the moment you can make a Spiritual Communion (below):

Sacrament of Confession

Although it is not possible (unless a person is in danger of death) to go to confession at this time, God's love knows no bounds and His mercy has no limits. It is, therefore, understood, that all that is required of you, and what the Bishops of England and Wales are encouraging all of us to, is to make a sincere examination of conscience and a heartfelt confession to God of your sins accompanied by a firm intention to go to confession to a priest as soon as you are able to in the future.

An Act of Contrition

O my God, because you are so good, I am very sorry that I have sinned against You, and with the help of Thy grace, I will not sin again.
