

Dear Parishioners,

This Thursday (the Feast of St Matthias, Apostle and Martyr) is a day of prayer and fasting for interreligious dialogue. This year, the pontifical council invites us to unite with all people of all faiths in prayer and fasting for the shared intention of the alleviation of and the ultimate end to the coronavirus threat. This is the best form of interreligious and interfaith dialogue - when we untie together and stand (or rather kneel) alongside our brothers and sisters in faith as we all face in the same direction towards God in a common cause.

In today's Gospel Jesus imparts to us words of comfort and assurance that there are many rooms in the Father's House. As we pray for an end to the coronavirus, we also pray especially for all those whose lives have been lost to the pandemic; that they may rest in peace and be at peace in one of those many rooms.

An open letter from the Vatican to the religious leaders of the world as well as communique from the *Higher Committee for Human Fraternity* asks us to mark this Thursday as a special day of prayer for all those affected by the virus. ## **Spiritual communion.**

Although you cannot receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament at the moment you can make a Spiritual Communion (below):

My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Although it is not possible (unless a person is in danger of death) to go to confession at this time, God's love knows no bounds and His mercy has no limits. It is, therefore, understood, that all that is required of you, and what the Bishops of England and Wales are encouraging all of us to do, is to make a sincere examination of conscience and a heartfelt confession to God of your sins accompanied by a firm intention to go to confession to a priest as soon as you are able to in the future.
