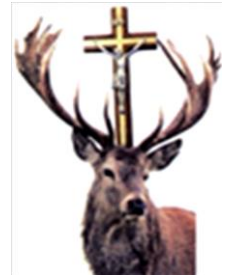

The church will be open for private prayer at the times shown above on Saturdays and Sundays.

On Saturday 20th and 27th June the church will be open from 5:00pm to 7:00pm. On Sunday 21st and 28th June the church will be open from 10:00am to 12 noon. During these times you will be able to come to church for private prayer. There will be no led devotions and there will be no service taking place. Although the church will be open during these times it should be understood that during this period of social distancing that we are going through there is no obligation to attend church during these times. Indeed, if you fall within one of the at risk categories my advice to you would be to stay safe at home. Please also stay away from the church if you are showing clear symptoms of the coronavirus.

If you are intending to come to church for private prayer (at the times published) please be aware of the following restrictions:

- **There will be no toilet facilities available**
- The church doors will be locked until 5:00pm (Saturday) and 10:00am (Sunday), so please do not arrive before these times as this will create an unnecessary gathering outside of the church. As there is no service taking place there is no requirement to "be there for 5" or "be there for 10"
- Social distancing will be maintained at all times
- Please bring and use your own personal protection equipment. (Hand sanitiser will be available at church)
- There will be no votive stand available and no lighting of candles.

- Gatherings around statues (or anywhere within or outside of the church) should be avoided.
- Please do not touch the statues.
- Ushers will direct you to your seats to help maintain social distancing and to keep the necessary cleaning down to a minimum.
- If you need a cushion to sit on you will need to bring your own cushion with you (since the church cushions have been removed from the pews).
- There will be a one-way system in operation in the church - again to help maintain social distancing.
- A newsletter will be available as you exit the church (to be taken with you).

The funeral for Tess Chilton will take place on Wednesday 24th of June (the Feast of the Birthday of John the Baptist). Please keep Tess and her family in your prayers at this time, and especially on that day. Although, due to the current restrictions, only family members can attend the chapel for the funeral ceremony itself, the hearse will be leaving for the crematorium from St Hubert's church and you are all warmly invited to come to the church at 12:30 to see her off. If, however, you have been self-isolating it may be wise to keep your distance.

The service is streamed live. Afterwards it will be unavailable for 5 days but after these 5 days it will be available again for 28 days.

Spiritual Communion.

Although you are still unable to attend mass at church I continue to encourage you to follow a Sunday service online using one of the many broadcasts available online down www.mcnmedia.tv. Although you cannot receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament at the moment you can make a Spiritual Communion (*see above prayer*):

My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as being already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen. (*St Alphonsus Ligouri*)

Sacrament of Confession

Although it is not possible (unless a person is in danger of death) to go to confession at this time, God's love knows no bounds and His mercy has no limits. It is, therefore, understood, that all that is required of you, and what the Bishops of England and Wales are encouraging all of us to do, is to make a sincere examination of conscience and a

heartfelt confession to God of our sins accompanied by a firm intention to go to confession to a priest as soon as you are able to in the future.

An Act of Contrition

O my God, because you are so good, I am very sorry that I have sinned against You, and with the help of Thy grace, I will not sin again.

This is not in any way a request or an appeal for money.
