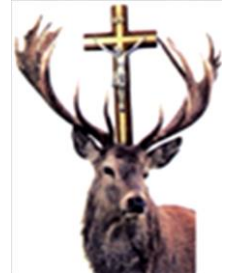

The church will be open for Holy Hour next Saturday, **5:30pm**, and for mass on Sunday

Although public mass is being celebrated here again on Sundays it should be understood that during this period of social distancing there is no obligation to attend mass at church. The Bishops of England and Wales' temporary dispensation from the Sunday obligation still stands. Attending mass therefore is an optional and individual choice. If you fall within the extremely vulnerable category of shielding and have received specific personal instructions from the Government not to attend religious services then, obviously, you must not attend. Nothing in any church guidelines seeks to overrule any Government advice given to an individual. Indeed if you are unsure or concerned about this at all my advice to you would be to stay safe at home. Please also stay away from the church if you are showing clear symptoms of the coronavirus.

If you are intending to come to church for private prayer or for mass, at the times published, please be aware of the following restrictions:

- Unless there is a medical reason that prevents you from wearing one, you will need to bring and wear a face mask or visor
- There will be no toilet facilities available
- The church doors will be locked until 5:00pm (Saturday) and 9:45am (Sunday), so please do not arrive before these times as this will create an unnecessary gathering outside of the church.
- Social distancing will be maintained at all times
- There will be only one votive stand, near the Lady chapel, available for the lighting of votive candles.

- Gatherings around statues (or anywhere within or outside of the church) should be avoided.
- Please do not touch the statues.
- Ushers will direct you to your seats to help maintain social distancing and to keep the necessary cleaning down to a minimum.
- If you need a cushion to sit on you will need to bring your own cushion with you (since the church cushions have been removed from the pews).
- There will be a one-way system in operation in the church - again to help maintain social distancing.
- A newsletter will be available as you exit the church (to be taken with you).

Spiritual Communion.

Although you may still be unable to attend mass at church I continue to encourage you to follow a Sunday service online using one of the many broadcasts available online down www.mcnmedia.tv. Although you cannot receive Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament at the moment you can make a Spiritual Communion (*see prayer below*).

Spiritual Communion Prayer

My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as being already there and unite myself wholly to You.
