SCRIPTURAL REFLECTION - A heart and faith that does justice

If a survey were to be conducted among churchgoers, among all of you here today, in which you were asked for a definition of religion, it is unlikely that many of you would come up with the simple answer provided by James (2nd reading). Coming to the help of orphans and widows (isolated and vulnerable) would be for many a kind of agreeable by-product of religion, whereas James places it right at the centre of who we are and what we do. This is surely a message for us today, when so many people go to such great lengths in their search for wisdom and the knowledge of God. A religion that can be observed at a purely external level (like the Pharisees) has a certain appeal. It is easy to feel we are making progress and that we are better than those who do not measure up. We imagine that by our own efforts we can come close to God. However, Jesus wants no part in such a sham. He is concerned with the heart and a faith that does justice.
