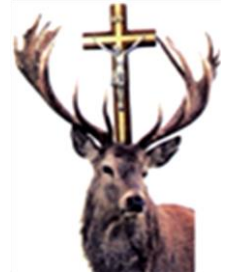

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - Fr Roger will not be available for confession at the usual time on Saturday evening (from 5:30pm) for a few weeks but he is available from 10:30-10:45 Saturday morning, or by appointment.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY- in the unlikely event that we need to empty the church in an emergency please make sure you are aware of the fire escape routes. A message from the Bishops' Conference ahead of the Assisted Dying Bill which is due to receive its Second Reading, with full debate, on Friday 22 October 2021.

Archbishop Bernard Calls on us to pray the following Novena for the right outcome to be reached regarding this bill.

Novena to St John Paul II

There will be a national novena seeking the intercession of St John Paul II, on whose feast the Second Reading falls. **It will run from 13th-22nd October.** You will find a short and simple novena prayer for use in parish newsletters in the weeks ahead. This will also be

Bishop John Sherrington (the Bishop responsible for the Day for Life) has said of the Novena: "Jesus told his disciples to pray at all times and not lose heart. Providentially the discussion of Baroness Meacher's Bill in the House of Lords falls on the feast of St John Paul II on 22nd October. The novena, asking the intercession of St. John Paul II, who spoke courageously about the infinite worth of each human person and witnessed to the cross in his final illness, calls upon Catholics and all who share our view that assisted suicide is wrong, to pray with perseverance that this Bill will be defeated. St. John Paul II, pray for us.'
