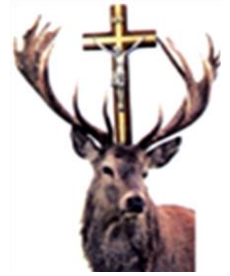

Racial Justice Sunday - This weekend is designated as racial justice Sunday please mark the day by praying the words of Pope Francis in *Fratelli Tutti*:

RCIA: continues this Tuesday 15th February at 7pm in the Conference Room. RCIA is a Course for Adults who are thinking of becoming a Catholic (or just enquiring about the faith), or for Adults who were baptised Catholic and would now like to be confirmed.

Security: Please always take care of your belongings (handbags, phones etc.) We recently had a theft of several items during Sunday mass.

Spiritual Communion Prayer. My Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as being already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

In Case of Emergency. Please make sure you are aware of the fire escape routes. One is located at the entrance door that you will have come through as you entered the church. The second is through the toilet corridor and conference room. After you have evacuated, please do not leave the site but gather on the grass lawn.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - is available every Saturday morning immediately after the 10:00am mass and from 5.30 pm before the evening mass and by appointment with Fr Roger.

Parish Census - If you would like to fill in a census form you will find them at the back of the church, they need to be handed to Ann

Williams, our safeguarding officer, to comply with the general data protection rules (GDPR).

Going into Hospital - It is important that you notify the parish or ask to be referred to the relevant catholic chaplain, if you or a member of your family are admitted into hospital. If you ever find yourself in hospital and would like a visit from a Catholic Priest, just ask a nurse on your ward and they should arrange this for you.

Altar Servers - We have for a while now had a notice in the newsletter appealing for new and existing servers to get in touch (at present we have had only 1 person contact us), which I'm sure you will recognise leaves us short. Because it has been so long since we have been able to fully use altar servers there will be a period of training before you can start serving again on the altar to refresh memories.
