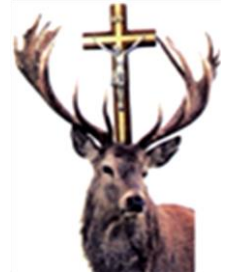

The RCIA programme continues this week on Tuesday at 7pm. Please continue to pray for the 6 people who are going through a period of enquiry and discernment.

Writing your will? Have you ever thought about leaving a legacy? It is now almost 90 years since the church of St Hubert's was built and before we know it, we will soon be celebrating our centenary.

With this landmark date approaching in the not-too-distant future we are looking to make the external walls and roof properly pointed and weatherproof so that we will then be able to redecorate and refurbish the inside. A couple of items that need special attention are our magnificent organ and our now too-long-silent church bell. It would certainly be wonderful to hear our bell ring out once more.

All this work will, however, as I am sure you can imagine, cost money and it is with this in mind that I gently "pose the question": have you ever thought about leaving a legacy to the church? People often leave money to their favourite charities but all too often the thought of leaving money to the church never occurs to them. If you were so inclined to set up a legacy, there is a link on the parish website to

pages on the diocesan website which provides instructions and information on how to arrange this.

Remembrance Lilies or Yellow Roses: Once again, this year, you have a choice between lilies and yellow roses. Either a lily or a rose, 'named' in memory of a loved one, will be placed in front of the altar, over the Easter festivities. **This weekend is the last opportunity to enrol**. All you have to do is put the name of your loved one and your own name on the appropriate list (Lilies or Roses) at the back of the Church. The cost per Lily is £1.50 each the cost per Rose is £1.80.

Loose change collection - During lent, to assist in our requirement to give alms (as well as pray and fast) a collection will be taking place for Fr Hudson's Care. A basket will be available at the back of church or in the porch area. Father Hudson's Care are coordinating the diocesan plan to **aid the people of Ukraine** who may need assistance in the coming weeks and months. They are working with existing communities in Coventry and Wolverhampton as well as recognised charities.

Stations of the cross - During Lent every Friday there will be mass at 6.30 pm followed by the Lenten devotion of 'Stations of the Cross'

Security: Please always take care of your belongings (handbags, phones etc.) We recently had a theft of several items during Sunday mass.

In Case of Emergency. Please make sure you are aware of the fire escape routes. The gathering point is on the grass lawn.

Going into Hospital - It is important that you notify the parish or ask to be referred to the relevant catholic chaplain, if you or a member of your family are admitted into hospital. If you ever find yourself in hospital and would like a visit from a Catholic Priest, just ask a nurse on your ward and they should arrange this for you.

Parish Census - If you wish to fill in a form they are available at the back of church. Completed forms can be handed in to Ann Williams.

Sacrament of Reconciliation - is available every Saturday morning immediately after the 10:00am mass and from 5.30 pm before the evening mass and by appointment with Fr Roger.
