

Divine Mercy Sunday



On Feb. 22, 1931, Our Lord appeared to Sister Faustina Kowalska, bringing with him a wonderful message of Mercy for all humanity. Sister Faustina tells us in her diary under this date: "In the evening when I was in my cell, I became aware of the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From the opening in the garment at the breast there came forth two large rays, one red, and the other pale. In silence I gazed intently at the Lord; my soul was overwhelmed with fear, but also with great joy. After a while Jesus said to me: "paint an image according to the pattern you see, with this inscription: 'Jesus, I trust in you.'"

Sometime later, Our Lord again spoke to her: "The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous; the red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of my most tender Mercy at that time when My agonized heart was opened by a lance on the Cross.. Fortunate is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him."
