RCIA: It is about the time of year that we normally begin our inctruction of adults who want to become Catholic. If you fit this description - or know of someone who does then please let either Fr Roger or Deacon David know. As well as being for adults who are thinking of becoming a Catholic (enquiring about the faith) this course is also suitable for Adults who were baptised Catholic but for whatever reason where never confirmed and would now like to be confirmed.

Sacramental preparation for young people not at catholic schools – This is an advance notice for parents of children who are at the age when, if they wer attending a Catholic school, they would be being prepared for the sacraments of initiation – which is to say First Holy Communion for year 3 children or above and year 6 or above (or possibly year 5) for Confirmation. If this applies to you please let us know. Previously our First Holy Communion the training sessions have taken place in the church conference room on Saturday mornings at 10:30am (and lasting about an hour). Please also let us know if you have previously enquired about having your children prepared for the sacraments since now is the time to apply for this. If you are
