It is a sign of the times and unsurprising / The need for change is urgent. / Very concerned, parish visibly threatened. / Better use of deacons, and encouragement of a greater involvement of the laity. / There is a need for priests to be married, and female priests. /I will attend another church if mass is at 5pm on Sunday. / What a wonderful time for mass, 5 pm would be on a Sunday / It's good that discussions are happening. / There will be an ever-decreasing pool of priests for the foreseeable future. / Saturday evening mass suits me best. / There are so many parishes in such a small area. / We have plenty of choice around us. / It may be difficult for families with young children to attend 5 pm mass. / Things must change, my friend in another part of the country has the cluster model and it is working well. / Do not allow more affluent parishes to rule the roost. / I'm reliant on buses so some of the times would be very difficult for me. / Have 2 masses one early and the other in the evening. / There is a simple but radical solution to the shortage of priests. / I do not mind, as long, as there is a mass. / It is time for the church to change and include more options for priesthood, married & female. / More overseas priests, ordain deacons to the priesthood. / Please stay at 10 am, it is more realistic with children.
