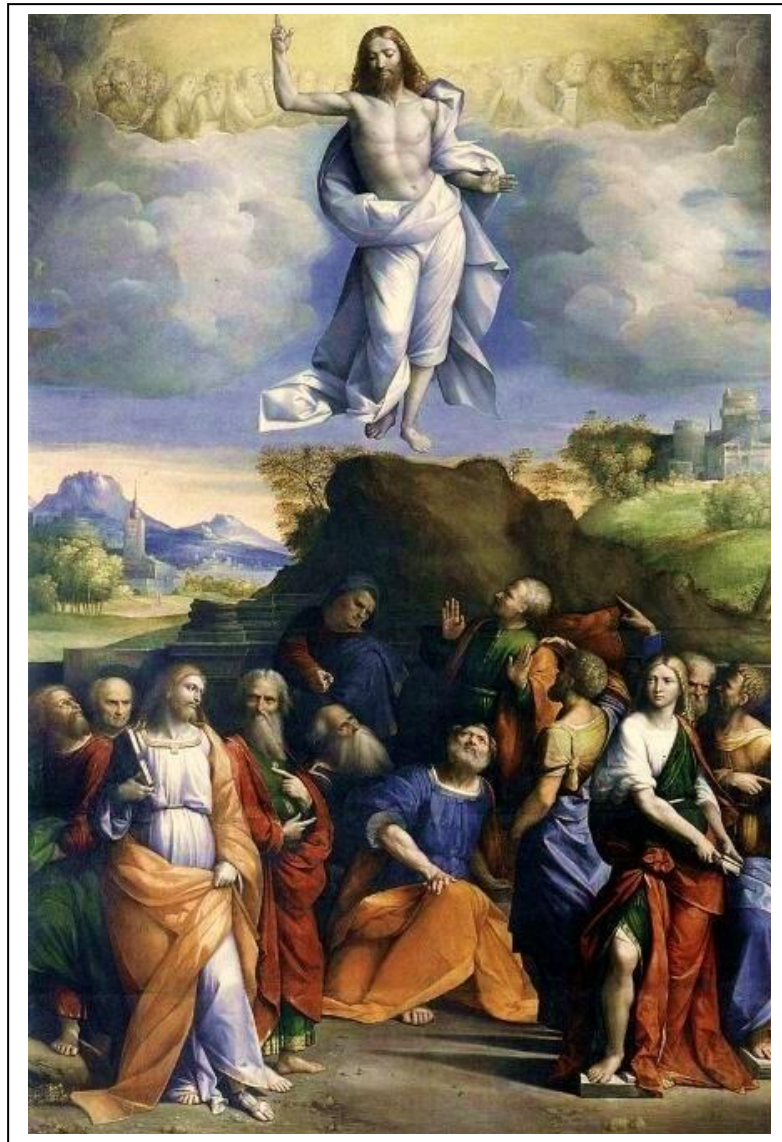

The Ascension by Garofalo



Garofalo's *Ascension* is reminiscent of Rafael's *Transfiguration*. It seems reasonable to assume that the twelve figures at the bottom depict the twelve apostles who together represent the Church on earth. The Saints and the Angels can also be seen at the top of the painting welcoming Jesus into heaven. The artist has perhaps chosen to include Judas (maybe the slightly isolated figure at the back in the shadows pointing a finger) even though he wasn't present at the actual event. As regards the identity of the other figures my guess would be that the two figures at the front represent John and Matthew (seen holding their *Gospel Accounts*). Presumably as well the distant mountain on the left is the mount of Olives and the citadel on the right is Jerusalem. I don't believe, though, that there is any consensus on any of this, so you are free to make your own determination!
